Adduct got out of Vietnam just before Christmas in 1970. After getting off a plane in Seattle, she threw her uniform away and traveled in civilian clothes. "I just wanted to be out of that country," she said. "I just wanted to be in the US. I didn't have to be in the Army anymore."
